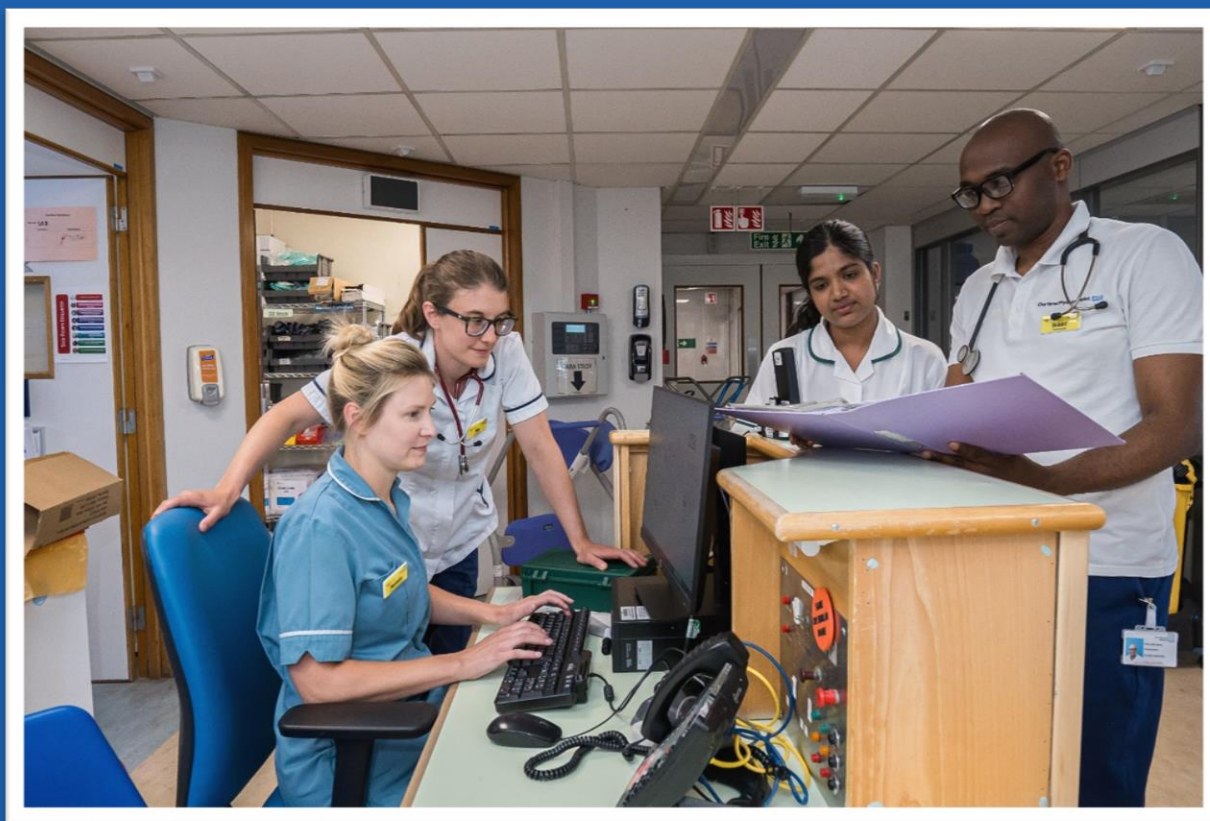

Poppy's Promise

Poppy's Promise is a compassionate care initiative introduced within this Trust to enhance communication, respect and empathy across every aspect of patient care.

The initiative was founded by Katie Russell, following the loss of her daughter Poppy, who tragically died at just twelve hours old due to failures in care and communication. Born from that experience, Poppy's Promise serves as a powerful reminder that while clinical skill saves lives, it is compassion, listening and respect that define the quality of care and human connection. By embedding this promise across our organisation, we ensure that no patient or family ever feels unseen, unheard, or uncared for.

Poppy's Promise is a five-stage framework that supports NHS staff to provide compassionate, consistent and patient-centred care. It aims to create a culture where empathy and communication are prioritised at every level – from education and recruitment to daily patient interactions.

At the heart of the initiative lies the C.A.R.E. framework, which outlines four guiding principles for staff to follow. The CARE principles form the foundation of Poppy's Promise. They describe the behaviours, attitudes and values that underpin every interaction – between staff and patients, staff and families, and colleagues with one another.

CARE is not an additional task. It is how care is delivered.

C.A.R.E. Meaning and Practice

Compassion - Demonstrate genuine kindness, empathy and humanity in every interaction. Compassion means recognising the emotional as well as the physical needs of patients, families and colleagues, and responding with care, patience and understanding. Small acts of compassion can have a lasting impact.

Acknowledge - Actively listen and be fully present. Use eye contact, names and open body language, and acknowledge the individual's feelings, concerns and lived experience. Every person should feel seen, heard and taken seriously.

Respect - Treat everyone with dignity, honesty and fairness at all times. Respect individual differences, personal circumstances and lived experience. Trust is built through respectful behaviour, consistency and integrity.

Empower - Enable people to be active participants in their care and work. Communicate clearly, encourage questions and shared decision-making, and ensure patients, families and colleagues feel informed, confident and included. Poppy's Promise is more than a framework – it represents a cultural shift towards human-centred care. By adopting these principles, we:

- Strengthen trust and communication between staff and patients
- Reduce avoidable harm through better understanding and listening
- Improve patient experience and staff wellbeing
- Foster a culture of openness, empathy and shared responsibility

Every member of staff has a role to play in bringing Poppy's Promise to life. Whether you are clinical, administrative or support staff, compassion and communication are part of everyone's role.

In daily practice, you can:

- Take a moment before entering a patient's space – centre yourself, focus on the person, not the task
- Use clear, respectful and kind language
- Listen without interruption and acknowledge emotions expressed
- Be honest and transparent, even when conversations are difficult
- Reflect after interactions – consider how your approach made the patient or family feel

All staff within the Trust are expected to:

- Uphold the values of Poppy's Promise in all patient and colleague interactions
- Attend any training, workshops or refreshers provided as part of the initiative
- Support colleagues in modelling compassionate behaviours
- Raise concerns constructively when communication or respect fall short
- Reflect these principles in both professional and personal conduct within the workplace

Together, we can make every interaction an opportunity to care, listen and make a difference.

That is Poppy's Promise.

Job Purpose

To be responsible for the decontamination of endoscopes and accessory equipment following appropriate training and competency assessment.

To include identifying repairs and concerns. To be responsible for all general housekeeping duties within the decontamination area of the Endoscopy unit

To be responsible for ensuring adequate stocks of consumables within the decontamination area are maintained to meet service requirements and that all equipment within the decontamination area is clean and in good working order.

To carry out any further tasks as required under the direction of the Decontamination Team Leader and Senior Sisters.

Main Duties and Responsibilities

- To provide safe and appropriate care to all endoscopes and accessory equipment, always acting in accordance with local Trust policy and guidelines.

The post holder will provide high quality decontamination support to the Unit Managers across both Shrewsbury and Telford Hospitals under guidance of the Team Leader.

- The post holder will facilitate processes in accordance with local and national policy and liaise with service personnel as necessary.
- The post holder will be responsible for ensuring that the Team Leader is informed of stock requirement to enable the service to run efficiently.
- The post holder will be responsible for ensuring that the Team leader or Unit Management team is appraised of any issues that may directly affect the day to day running of the service or impact on clinical patient services.

Responsibilities

- Participate as a team in ensuring that the Units decontamination facilities work in accordance with all relevant guidelines.
- Oversee the preparation of endoscopic equipment and accessories required during procedures.
- Support the Team Leader and management team to ensure an efficient and appropriate service is provided to all service users.
- Work under guidance of the Team Leader to ensure work is done in an organised manner.
- Adhere to good standards of practice as trained.
- Record and submit relevant clinical incident information when events happen through non conformance reporting.
- To have a knowledge of the working mechanisms of endoscopes and accessory equipment to ensure maintenance and safe use within the working environment. Reporting faulty equipment to the Team Leader.
- To follow National, Local and Trust guidelines in the maintenance and decontamination of endoscopes including compliance with all local Standard Operating Policies.
- Compliance with appropriate use of PPE referring to the standard operating procedures as required.
- Ensure all staff and visitors (support services) always wear the appropriate PPE.
- Ensure traceability system is used accordingly and accurately.
- Ensuring all skills are current and up to date ensuring that standards for decontamination are adhered to.
- To assist in the effective use of resources when maintaining and monitoring adequate levels of stock and endoscopic equipment/accessories within decontamination.
- Maintain and ensure general cleanliness and tidiness of decon areas.
- In conjunction with the Decontamination Team Leader, review SOPs as required
- Assist in the facilitation of changes to equipment/software.
- Support and adapt to any changes that are implemented to improve the service.

- Commit to continuing personal professional development both through Departmental and Trust training schemes.
- In collaboration with the Nurse Coordinator and Team Leader, ensure an adequate supply of endoscopes are available to use.
- Participate in trials of new consumable items; collate feedback from nursing/medical staff to inform purchasing decisions if required.
- Undertake any other tasks, within capability, as directed by the Decontamination Team Leader.
- Answer telephone calls, email, take messages and ensure that the appropriate action is taken.
- Maintain accurate records in accordance with local guidelines; written and computerised.
- Communicate departmental issues quickly and share knowledge.
- Accurately record all necessary information for reprocessing of medical devices.

Education and Personal Development

- Take personal responsibility for maintaining, developing and acquiring competencies and skills as necessary by identifying personal training needs and together with the Decontamination Team Leader and Practice Educational Facilitator, develop an action plan to achieve them.
- Participate in annual appraisal, agreeing a personal development plan.
- Assist with training in the minor maintenance and decontamination of endoscopes and their accessories for qualified and unqualified staff.
- Attend relevant study days/lectures where appropriate, to both update and increase knowledge.
- Attend mandatory training sessions.
- Demonstrate an awareness of developments and current issues in endoscopy.
- Ensure that all local and national HR policies, procedures and guidelines are adhered to and report any failure to do so appropriately.

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General conditions

If you are found to have permitted the unauthorised disclosure of any such information, you and the Trust may face legal action.

- **Information Quality and Records Management** - You must ensure that all information handled by you is accurate and kept up-to-date and you must comply with the Trust's recording, monitoring, validation and improvement schemes and processes.
