Registration	Current Nursing and Midwifery Council registration (NMC) or Current Health and Care Professions Council registration (HCPC)
Essential Qualifications	Evidence of extensive post graduate experience and significant experience at band 6 level or equivalent in a recent critical care/ ITU setting.
	Evidence of extensive professional/clinical knowledge in intensive care medicine/ critical care supplemented by specialist clinical training and CPD
	Effective communicator able to communicate complex and highly sensitive information
	Evidence of effective people management and leadership skills
	Ability to work/study at Masters level and complete associated academic qualification for role within a set timeframe. This includes both clinical and academic criteria to become an Advanced Clinical Practitioner and register with FICM as a qualified ACCP.
	Evidence of GCSE Maths at Grade 9-4 or equivalent level of qualification
	Evidence of GCSE English at Grade 9-4 or above or equivalent level of qualification
Desirable Qualifications	Evidence of involvement in policy and practice change
	Evidence of proactive involvement in the mentorship and development of nurses or other allied health professionals in clinical/academic practice
	Computer literacy
	Non-Medical Prescriber
Knowledge, Skills and Experience	Demonstrates specialist expertise underpinned by theory acquired through CPD
	Evidence of involvement in the development of programmes of care, protocols and clinical audit
	Highly developed effective communication/negotiation skills
	Excellent clinical reasoning / clinical decision making

	Evidence of involvement and leadership in teaching and mentoring learners
Physical & Mental Requirements Working	Physical effort: The post holder will be required to exert frequent moderate physical effort for several short periods during a shift e.g. moving patients over 15 kilos with mechanical aids
environment	Mental effort: To exert frequent concentration on patient assessment and responding to frequent changing needs in the clinical area
	Emotional effort: the post holder will at times be exposed to distressing and frequent highly distressing and emotional circumstances (Dealing with patients/relatives as a result of a serious incident and end of life care planning)
	Working environment: Frequent exposure to unpleasant working conditions (challenging behaviour of patients, relatives and carers). Daily exposure to blood and body fluid.
